Description of the Practice (Uniqueness / Constraints / Limitations)

Problems encountered and Resources required

Challenges Faced:

- Adapting existing infrastructure without major structural changes
- Encouraging consistent usage of new tools and spaces by students and faculty
- Establishing a support system for maintenance and technical assistance

Resources Required:

- Continued investment in digital infrastructure and studio enhancements

- Sessions to promote effective use of the studio's features
